## THE SCOTTISH CHILD ABUSE INQUIRY WITNESS STATEMENT OF SISTER MARIE THERESE DOCHERTY

1.	My name is Marie Therese Docherty.	I have also been known in the past as Sister Alphonso.
	My date of birth is the	1941 and my contact details are known to the Inquiry.

- 2. I make this statement further to the statement that I made to the Inquiry dated the 2018.
- 3. I have given details of my background and how I entered the Order of the Sisters of the Nazareth and my time within the Order.
- 4. The Inquiry and others will be aware of the four convictions that I have had against me in relation to criminal proceedings that began in 2000. The Inquiry will also be aware that I had been originally charged with twenty four offences and, after a protracted hearing, was convicted of four offences through due process of the Court.
- 5. It is clear that a lot of the allegations were not made out but I acknowledge that the persons who made the allegations still feel that when they were within my care that I mistreated them and I regret this very much.
- 6. The Inquiry will be all too aware of the length of time which has passed in relation to when the allegations of which I was convicted have taken place. At the time of the Court proceedings in relation to the criminal case against me was a time of extreme difficulty for me but also, I am sure, for the persons who made the complaints. I had significant health difficulties at the time of the criminal case which, again, the Inquiry would be aware of and these health difficulties continue.
- 7. The Court case and the allegations that were made against me have been something that I have continuously thought about and reflected from the eighteen years since my conviction. I acknowledge that during the criminal case that I denied my involvement in the offences of which I was convicted and continued to deny the offences. This has been a long and difficult period in my life and I have reflected very carefully in relation to the matters that were made especially given the upcoming Inquiry. I want to assist the Inquiry as much as I possibly can and have thought deep and hard in relation to my time at which the convictions relate to and when the proceedings and convictions against me took place.
- 8. I would like to state now that I acknowledge and accept the findings of the Court and the convictions for the offences which I committed. This is a matter of deep regret to myself but moreso it troubles me significantly that I caused any harm by committing the offences and I am truly sorry and apologise for the hurt that I have caused to the persons affected.
- 9. I would only state that this has been a long process for everyone concerned and, whilst I understand my acknowledgement for committing the offences may come at a late stage, I do hope and pray that this acknowledgement will go some way to ease any pain and hurt that I may have caused and assist in the healing process which I hope the Inquiry will be able to fulfil.
