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Covid-19 Restrictions

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, Council staff have been unable to access Council buildings and records. This led to the premature ending of a comprehensive file audit and has limited the research opportunities and materials available to staff in compiling the responses listed below.

Question 5.4	External Inspections
a)	What external inspections have been conducted relating to children in foster care which considered issues relating to abuse and/or alleged abuse of children?
	Edinburgh Corporation (1930-1975)
	There is no reference within the surviving records to indicate if external investigations took place for this period.
	Lothian Regional Council (1975-1996)
	There is no reference within the surviving records to indicate if external investigations took place for this period.
	City of Edinburgh Council (1996-2014)
	The local authority has not found evidence of any external inspections which related only to the abuse or alleged abuse of children in foster care. However, the local authority has found inspection reports from inspections of fostering services which would have included issues relating to abuse and/or alleged abuse of children, for example, child protection procedures and complaints procedures. The local authority has chosen to include all of the inspection reports for completeness but recognises that abuse and/or alleged abuse may
	not have been specifically mentioned within some of the inspection reports.

Edinburgh and Lothians Registration and Inspection Service

Following local government re-organisation in 1996, the four successor authorities to Lothian Regional Council – East, West and Midlothian Councils and the City of Edinburgh Council – established the Edinburgh and Lothians Registration and Inspection Service (ELRIS) to provide an inspection services for the successor authorities. In 1999, this was extended to foster care provision following the publication of the Kent Report and consideration by the Edinburgh Inquiry (Ref. 'Edinburgh's Children', Marshall, 1999). While not external, the service was independent and has been included within this section for completeness around the inspection process that was evident at that time.

In terms of process, the Head of ELRIS reported through the City of Edinburgh Council's Director of Social Work to a Joint Committee of Edinburgh and the Lothian authorities. From the information available, it would appear that a pilot inspection process was run by ELRIS which inspected a sample of foster carers. The local authority has identified two of these inspection reports as part of its foster carer case file audit.

The first inspection report located concerned two foster carers: FSJ and SSZ While there were three complaints against the foster carers (two physical and one sexual), they were the subject of the inspection not in relation to the complaints themselves, but because they were chosen as part of a random sample by ELRIS into the Local Authority's fostering services (see below for details)

The second inspection report located concerned a foster carer called FZB

Although there was one complaint made against the foster carer of neglect, she was subject to the inspection not in relation to the complaint itself, but because she was chosen as part of a random sample by ELRIS into the Local Authority's fostering services (see below for details).

Scottish Commission for the Regulation of Care and Care Inspectorate

The local authority was registered with the Scottish Commission for the Regulation of Care, now Care Inspectorate, on 12 December 2005 in relation to its fostering services. The Care Inspectorate produced eight inspection reports between 12 December 2005 and 17 December 2014. In addition to this, there was a pilot inspection by the Care Inspectorate into fostering services at the local authority in May 2005.

	The inspection was conducted as part of a sample for the fostering services inspections by ELRIS. The FSJ-FSZ came up as part of that random sample.

	The inspection report was issued on 1 November 2000.

	While the report detailed the complaints against the foster carers, it was more systemic in focus and set out how the service dealt with those complaints and the individuals involved, including the foster carers.

	The report drew attention to several systemic issues. These included: timing, management, and conclusion of complaints against carers; the forming and tracking of permanency plans for children in the upper primary years; and the implications of training for carers in management of trauma and aggression.

	The inspection report recorded that the local authority's carer handbook, foster carer

	report also stated that the local authority had clear procedures and guidance in place in relation to allegations of abuse and complaints against carers.
