A police check was taken for FTM in December 1982 in relation to his wife becoming a registered day carer. There were two previous convictions: a road traffic offence from 1967 and a theft charge from 1975. Further police checks were undertaken against FTM in December 1987 and January 1988.

Medical reports were undertaken for in December 1982 and in both March and December 1987.

Allegation 1

The allegations were initially disclosed to the Hospital Social Worker. They were then referred to the Police for investigation on 25 July 1988, at the same time as the local authority was informed.

Allegation 2

A Consultative meeting was held on 25 March 1991 which was attended by the Police. It was agreed that an investigation into the complaints would take place and a referral would be made to the Woman and Child Unit. Information was provided to both Police Scotland and the Woman and Child unit.

Allegation 3

At the time this allegation was made, the Police were already investigating the foster carer in relation to another allegation. The liaison social worker contacted the Woman and Child Unit to inform them that there was another allegation.

The allegations were investigated, and FUU denied locking the child outside. No further action was taken by the local authority. Upon the Social Worker visiting the house, the foster child disclosed concerns about the emotional and physical care provided by the foster carer. He also disclosed an instance of being roughly handled by the foster carer's son-in-law who was also a respite carer. The child who made these allegations was removed from placement on 2014 and moved to a temporary placement. f) SO, what process Allegation 1 monitoring/supervision followed? The Social Worker investigated the allegations by the neighbour and found that neither the child nor his kinship carer had any concerns about the care provided by FUU Allegation 2 The Social Worker continued to monitor the placement through direct involvement with the foster carer and through the Practice Team Worker's involvement with the children. This included 2 referee statements, health and safety checks, medical assessments, local authority checks and police checks. She also attended preparation groups prior to approval.

e)	If so, why was this considered to be appropriate?	The Inter-Agency Referral Discussion was concluded on 23 October 2008 with no further child protection action being taken.
f)	If so, what process of monitoring/supervision followed?	The foster carer took 3 months time-out. She attended mediation sessions with her daughter. This was with an independent consultant provided by the local authority prior to allowing any future placements to take place.
